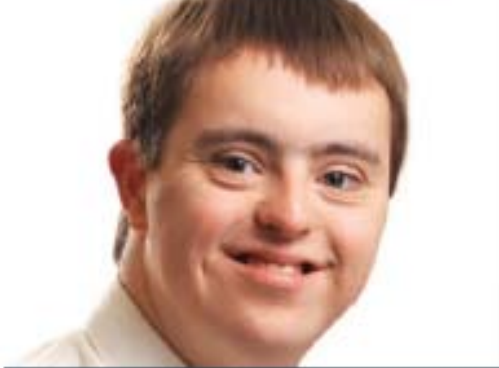

On Tuesday, January 19th Susan attended a Labour Market Ottawa (LMO) special lunch at the Restaurant International, Algonquin College to celebrate LMO achievements and to highlight upcoming activities. Over 100 guests

were in attendance (including several EARN members) to find out more about LMO's service coordination and employment engagement projects.

This event was also the venue chosen to announce a new pilot project: LMO has recently received funding from the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities to launch a Local Employment Planning Council (LEPC). There will be several of these councils rolled out across Ontario, with two in the eastern region located in Peterborough and Ottawa. We congratulate Labour Market Ottawa on their many achievements to date!!

Social Capital Partners

On Monday, January 25th, Kelly hosted a meeting at which Social Capital Partners (SCP) presented the “Ontario Community Loan Pilot” to a number of our service provider partners. SCP is launching this new

program together with a number of financial institutions (banks and credit unions) along with the Ministry of Economic Development, Employment and Infrastructure (MEDEI). Ottawa has been chosen as one of three Ontario pilot locations and SCP is reaching out to Employment Service Providers to share details of the program and discuss the potential of participation as a partner.

Participation as a partner in the pilot is the referral of job seeker clients and working directly with the Pilot Recruitment Liaison to fill employment opportunities available through employers participating in the pilot.

With the pilot hoping to start in March or April of 2016, SCP has advertised for a new position here in Ottawa that will be responsible for managing and coordinating the partners for the project: [Click Here](#) and United Way Ottawa will house the position (individual). This is be a great opportunity for EARN as we can tie in to the small and medium sized businesses that this program will attract as well as for our service provider partners as a means to promote their clients as potential employees for these businesses.

As a number of our members were interested in hearing about the program and were not able to attend the January meeting we are pleased to announce the following 2 opportunities to do so:

1. Social Capital Partners will be presenting at our upcoming EARN Joint Meeting on Tuesday February 9th from 9:00-9:45am. They will be presenting via conference call but will provide the power point to us and we will share it with you prior to the call.
2. We will also be hosting a separate conference call that will include other agencies that provide employment supports to immigrants and new Canadians and Aboriginals. You are more than welcome to join this call. It will be on Wednesday February 10th from 10-11am.

Success Stories:

The success story this month comes from the City of Ottawa. The theme is partnership.



Feeding Ottawa's Future Champions!

Here is a synopsis:

The City of Ottawa is committed to ensuring its workforce is qualified and reflective of the community it serves. Since 2002 when Council approved the Equity and Diversity Policy, the City has had a plan in place to ensure equitable and inclusive employment policies, programs and practices. One of the diversity groups identified in the City's Equity and Diversity Policy are people with disabilities.

In 2014, the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services Department needed to procure a new service provider for the

canteen at the Terry Fox Athletic Facility. With the support of the department's General Manager and the Recreation Supervisor of the Terry Fox Athletic Facility, staff engaged a student at Carleton University, to support the provision of canteen services through a social enterprise approach. Our student consulted with others to identify prospective service providers, develop a request for proposal, and, coordinate an evaluation of the proposals received from interested service providers. The outcome was that two service providers – Causeway Work Centre, through its social enterprise Krackers Katering and Innovative Community Support Services (ICSS) – partnered to supply the canteen services.

As a result of the City of Ottawa's effort to fill a need for one of its facilities through promoting a social procurement process, 8 persons living with a disability, and or, facing barriers to employment have gained paid employment. This marks a landmark in the growth of the social enterprise sector – an example which hopefully will be followed in other government/private venues.

We extend many thanks to Lois for sharing this success story with us!

Canada Summer Jobs Program: Even though winter continues to hold its grip on our city, warmer weather will come to embrace us sooner than we think. To that end, why not think about hiring a student with a disability for the summer? EARN's service provider members have a great talent pool to share! The federal government provides funding for the Canada Summer Jobs Program, 'designed to focus on local priorities, while helping both students and their communities.

Here are some key points:

- The application period is from **January 4th to February 26, 2016**;
- Funding goes to not-for-profits, public-sector employers and small businesses with 50 or fewer employees;
- To be eligible students aged 15 – 30 years must be full-time and intending to return to their studies the next year;
- Not –for-profit organizations can receive up to 100% of a wage subsidy at the provincial minimum wage level with public and private sector organizations eligible for up to a 50% wage subsidy;
- Additional funding up to a maximum of \$3000.00 is available to accommodate a student with a disability in the workplace; and
